




Top differences between Example Primary School and Nottingham City Primary

Key:

-  - Not significantly different
-  - Significantly worse than N City average

Interpretation

In the chart below a coloured circle represents Example Primary School's result, while the black line represents the mean for N City. The distance between the circle and the black line indicates the size of the difference between the percentages – the greater the gap, the larger the difference. The colour of the circle reflects whether a difference is statistically significant and if the difference is positive (green), negative (red) or if it is not statistically significant (blue).

26% (30%) of pupils said they are non-religious, while 25% (24%) said they are Christian and 23% (23%) said they are Muslim.

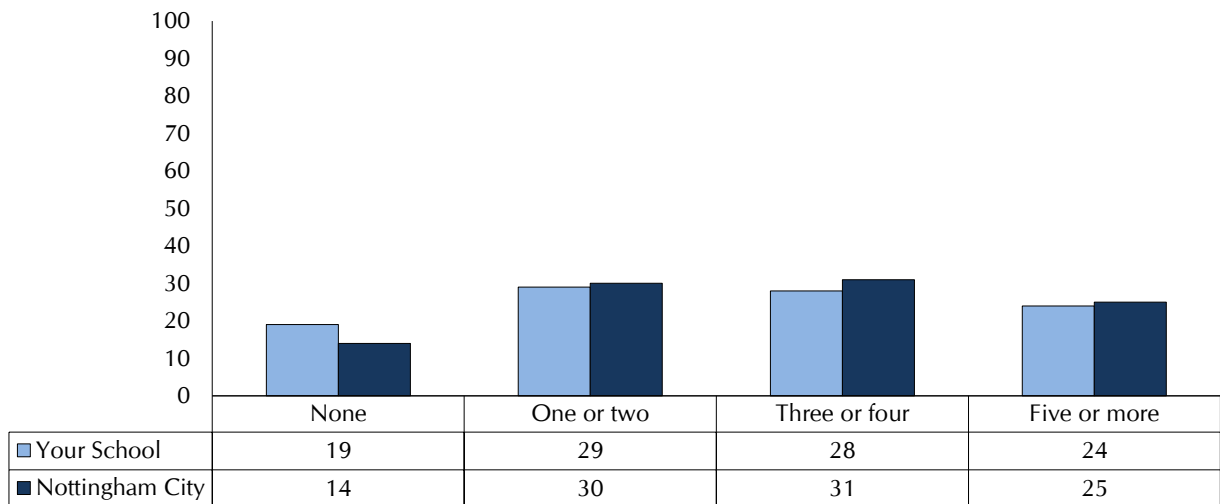

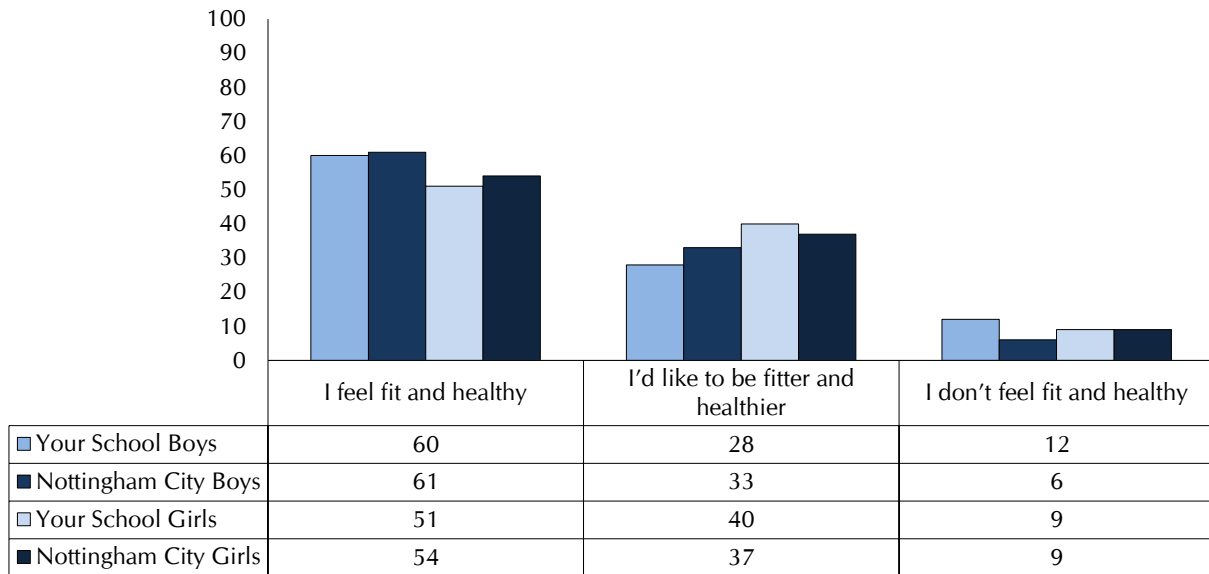

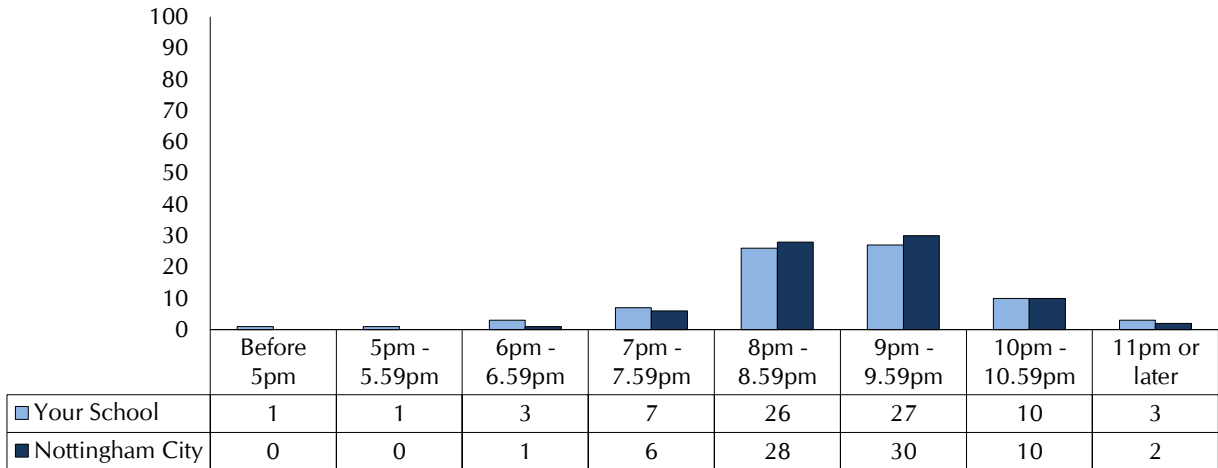

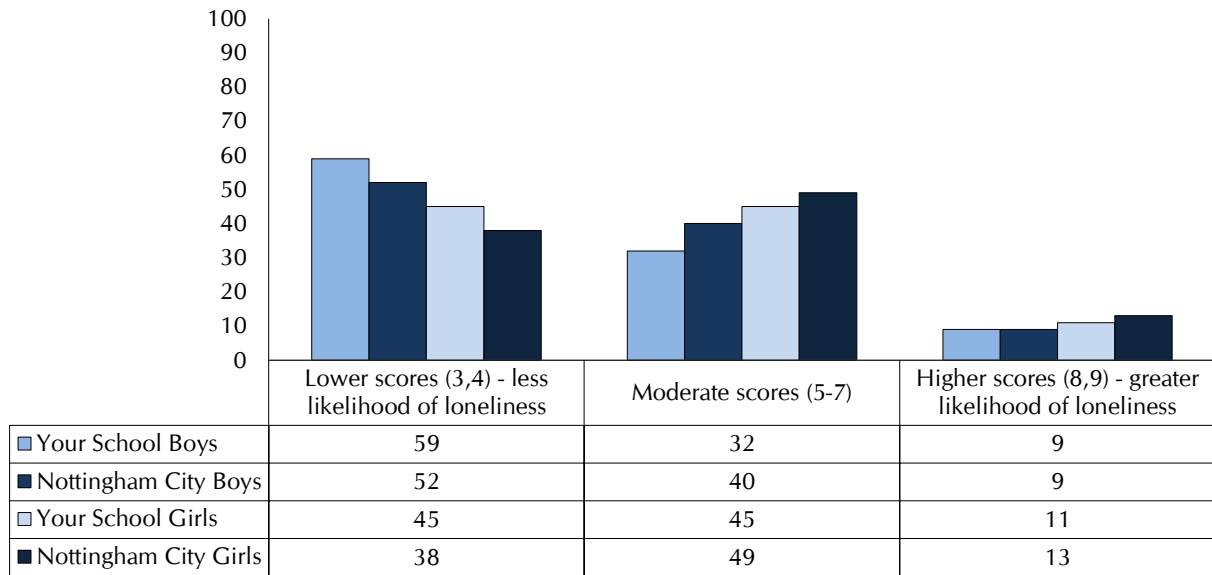

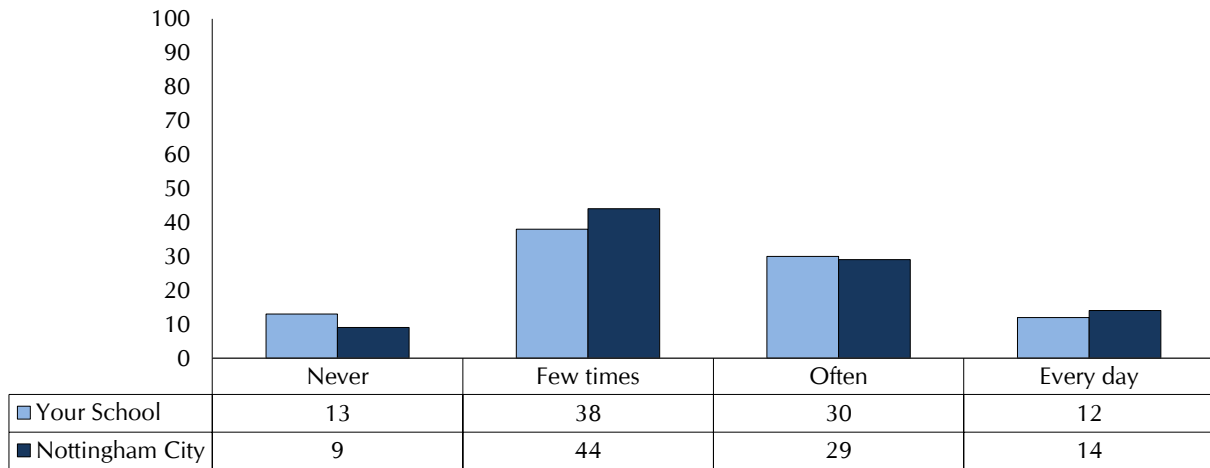

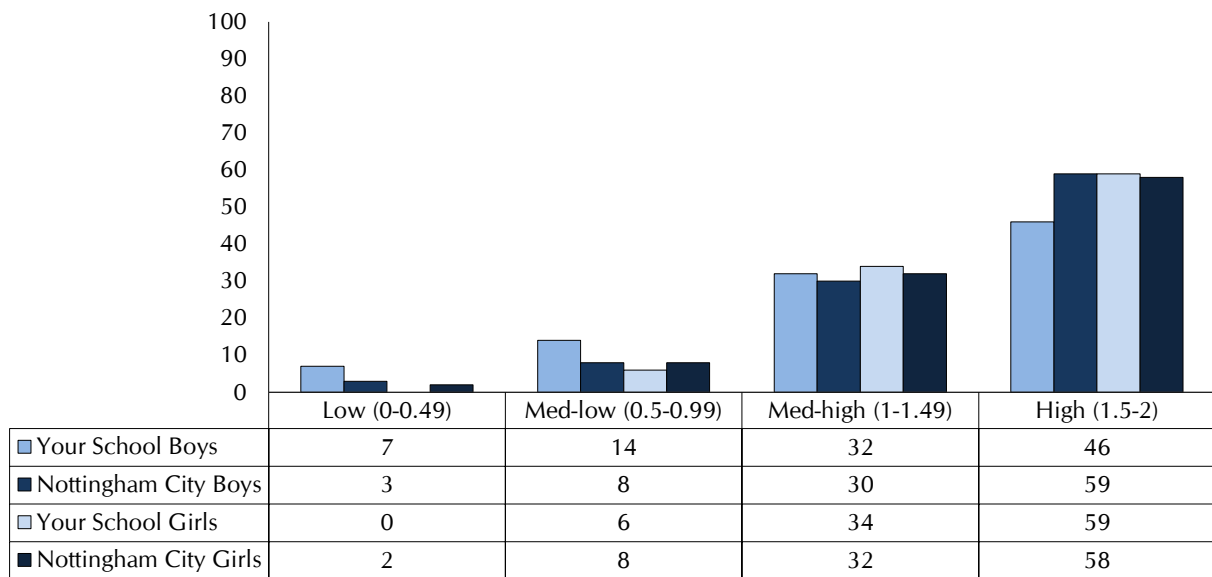
